Our History



The Cherokee Strip Community Foundation began in 2000 as the Enid Community Foundation for Excellence, dedicated to enhancing the quality of life in Enid and Northwest Oklahoma. With an initial \$1.8 million challenge match from the Sisters of Mercy, the foundation has since grown to over \$32 million in assets and distributes more than \$1 million in grants and scholarships annually. In 2009, we adopted the name Cherokee Strip Community Foundation to better reflect our service to all of Northwest Oklahoma.

Types of Funds:

UNRESTRICTED FUNDS

With an unrestricted fund, you can support the community's most pressing needs without specifying a particular program or charity. Our experienced staff and board assess current needs and award grants to nonprofits addressing critical community challenges.

FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS

A Field of Interest Fund allows you to focus your giving on an area of personal importance, such as youth, elderly services, literacy, or food security. Grants from this fund support initiatives within your chosen field or geographic area.

DESIGNATED FUNDS

Designated Funds let you support a specific nonprofit organization of your choice. Your gift provides a permanent, reliable funding source, along with investment and planned giving support for that organization.

AGENCY FUNDS (Organizational Endowment Fund)

Nonprofit and public organizations establish Agency Funds to ensure stable, long-term income for their mission. We manage all administrative and investment responsibilities, enabling organizations to focus fully on their work.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS

Donor-Advised Funds (DAFs) allow you to actively participate in grant-making. Support the causes you care about, grow your donation tax-free, and recommend grants to charities you choose. This fund is also a great way to engage family members in philanthropy.

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Create a Scholarship Fund to support students in reaching their educational goals. With your input, we establish scholarship criteria, manage applications, and handle awards, ensuring your gift makes a meaningful impact on students' lives.

2023 CSCF Fall Competitive Grants - Funds for Northwest Oklahoma

Each year the CSCF Grant Selection Committee reviews many submissions. This year, the committee selected 16 nonprofits that serve residents of Northwest Oklahoma to receive grant funds totaling \$70,035.00. The following

OUR CIP GRANTS THREE CORNERS CONNECTOR COMMUNITY FORMANDO Community Investment Program

CSCF awarded \$290,000 in grants from the Three Corners Connector Community Investment Program, benefiting nonprofits across the Panhandle communities. Funded by Grid United, which is developing the Three Corners Connector transmission line in Cimarron and Texas Counties, the program supports community-strengthening projects that enhance quality of life in Northwest Oklahoma. A local advisory committee reviewed applications to select impactful projects for funding. The following grants were awarded on December 18th, 2023:

Boise City Fire Department, \$20,000: replace pumper tanker equipment.

Cimarron County EMS, \$20,000: To help build a new ambulance station.

Cimarron County Food Pantry, \$20,000: For building expansion.

Felt Fire Department, \$10,000: To install a remote nozzle on a truck.

Guardians of the Ribbon, \$4,000: Assists cancer patients with co-pays, etc.

Hooker Fights Hunger Inc, \$20,000: To install freezer storage for frozen food.

Keyes Fire Department, \$10,000: To help replace an aging rescue truck.

Loaves and Fishes Food Cupboard (Guymon), \$25,000: Food purchases.

NW Domestic Crisis Services, \$21,000: For legal services to victims.

Panhandle Services for Children, \$22,500: Services for juvenile offenders.

Panhandle State Foundation, \$24,000: Establishes a scholarship at OPSU.

Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, \$16,500: Support food insecurity programs.

Ronald McDonald House, \$7,000: Housing families needing medical care.

Texas County Firefighters Assoc, \$25,000: Radios for 11 communities.

Panhandle Cares Association, \$6,000: Enhance health services for families.

Town of Texhoma, \$29,000: Renovate Little League fields for youth sports.

Wheeless-Mexhoma Fire Department, \$10,000: Remote water cannon.




